Job Title: Seasonal – Golf Course Maintenance Technician

Reports To: Golf Course Maintenance Manager

FLSA Status: Seasonal/Hourly (Approximately 36 weeks)

PURPOSE Responsible for performing routine golf course maintenance demonstrating safe practices for turf maintenance and operation of equipment. This position works closely with the Golf Maintenance Manager in many areas of daily/routine course maintenance. Work hours may vary, and may include weekdays, evenings, weekends, and holidays. A forty-hour work week is not guaranteed, depending on weather conditions and workload.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Responsible for routine golf course maintenance, including course set-up, equipment operation, pesticide/fertilizer application, hand watering/syringing, drainage installation, and bunker maintenance.
- Basic irrigation system repair to include valves, electrical, pipe, swing joint, satellite and irrigation heads.
- Must have a good work ethic, positive attitude and willingness to learn.
- Maintains a working knowledge of and adheres to all risk management and safety programs and procedures.
- Complete all other duties as assigned.

QUALIFICATIONS The requirements listed below are representative of the knowledge, skill, and/or ability required. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions. Must be at least 18 years old. Must have a valid Illinois Pesticide Operator license or the ability to obtain within 30 days of hire.

KNOWLEDGE REQUIRED FOR THE ROLE Ability to interpret a variety of instructions furnished in written, oral, diagram, or schedule form. Ability to work effectively and safely. Ability to drive standard transmission vehicles. Must have a valid driver's license.

EDUCATION and/or EXPERIENCE High School diploma or general education degree (GED) required. Training and/or experience in Turf Management, Agronomy, or Lawn and Landscape maintenance preferred.

MACHINES, TOOLS, AND EQUIPMENT All hand and power tools commonly used in lawn maintenance.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS While performing the duties of this job, the employee is frequently required to stand; walk; use hands to finger or handle; reach with hands and arms; climb or balance; stoop, kneel, crouch, or crawl; talk or hear; and taste or smell. The employee must frequently lift and/or move up to 75 pounds. Specific vision abilities required by this job include close vision, distance vision, color vision, peripheral vision, depth perception, and ability to adjust focus.

WORK ENVIRONMENT The employee is regularly exposed to outside weather conditions, moving mechanical parts, and vibration. The employee is frequently exposed to high, precarious places; fumes or airborne particles; toxic or caustic chemicals or plant materials; and risk of electrical shock. The noise level in the work environment is usually moderate.
